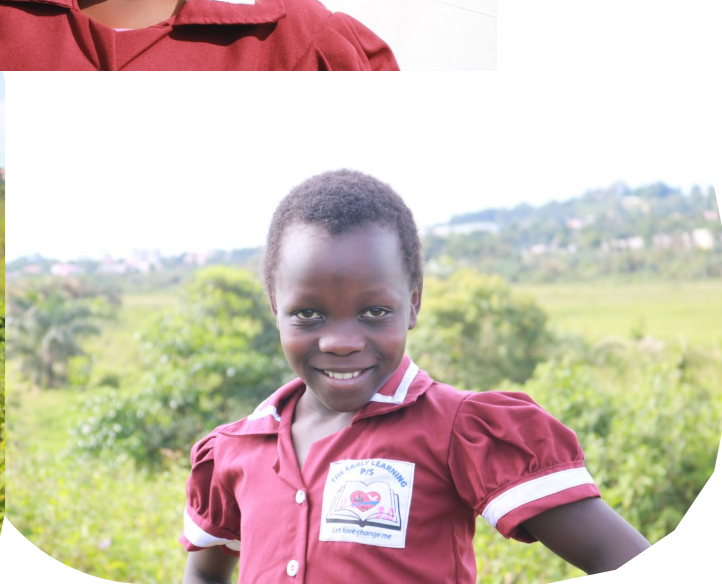




SPONSOR A CHILD PROFILE

My family moved from Congo to Uganda. Being a new country, my parents did not know anyone and they did not have jobs. The situation

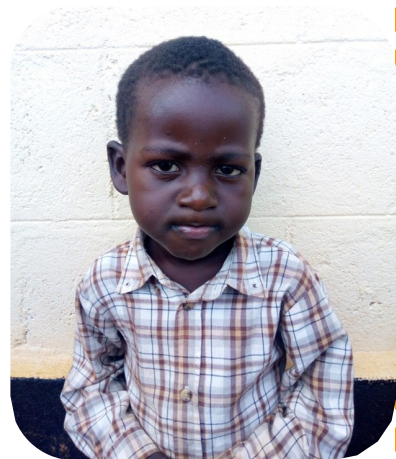
was hard for us as a family because even getting what to eat was not easy. It was in such a trying time that my father met Aunt Agnes who gave me and my siblings an opportunity to study.

such a trying time that my father met Aunt Agnes who gave me and my siblings an opportunity to study.



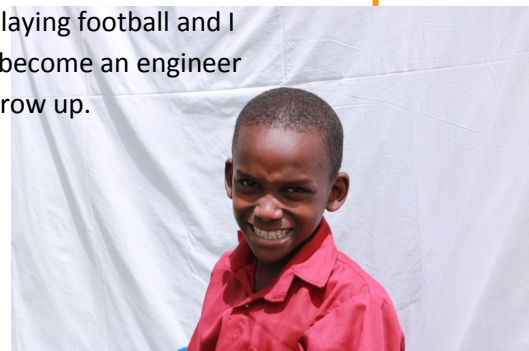
Chaisah Bwire (8 yrs)

At a young age, I ran

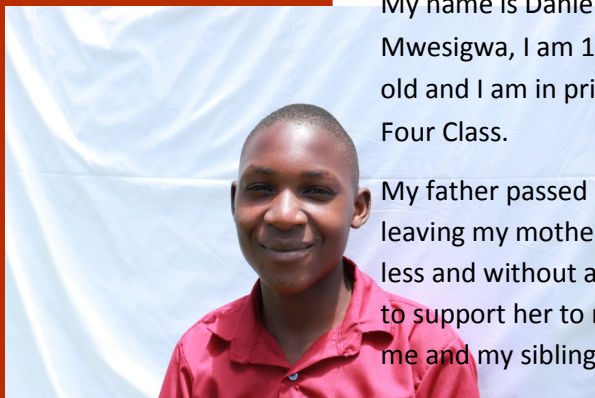

My name is Deborah Muwanguzi, I am 15 years old and I am in primary seven Class.

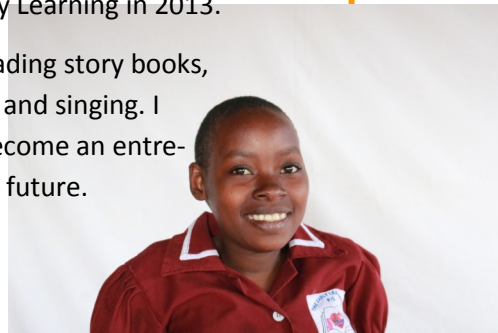
My parents separated immediately after my birth and my father brought me up until I was 5 years when my mother picked me from there.

Esther Akankwasa (15 yrs)

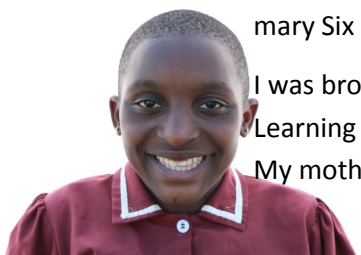
My name is Esther Akankwasa, I am 15 years old and I am in primary Six Class.

I enjoy playing football, calculating Mathematics numbers, playing video games. My favorite subject is Mathematics. I want to become an engineer in future.



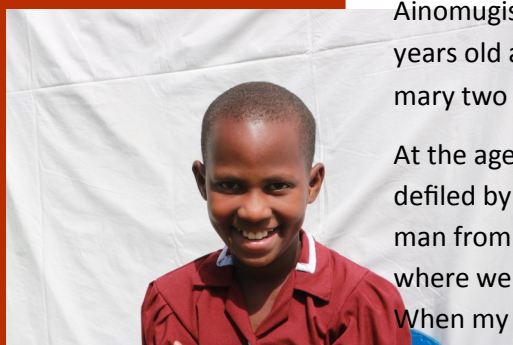
Hannah Ainomugisha (9 yrs)

I enjoy playing football, netball and swimming.



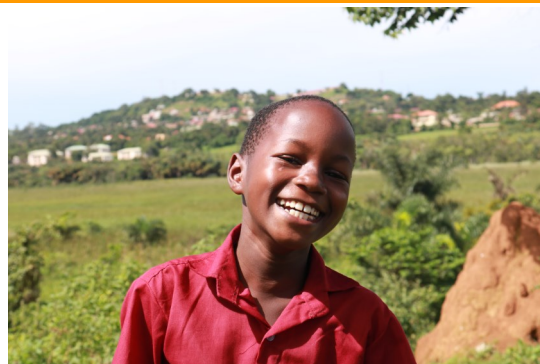
Israel Nasongi (8 yrs)

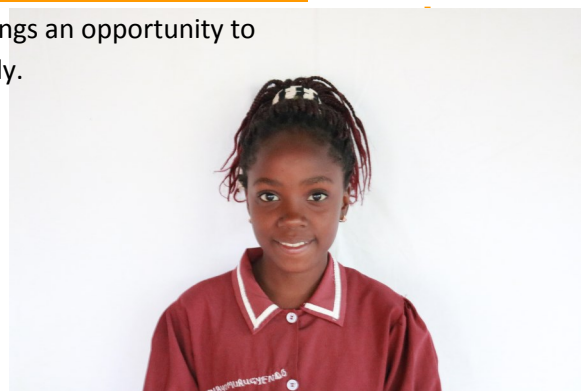

I had a place to call home but that changed when my parents separated. I was left homeless because all my

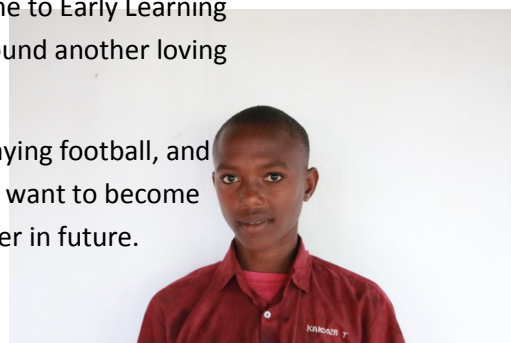
parents abandoned me.

I enjoy reading novels and singing, my favorite subject is English and I want to become a bank manager in future.



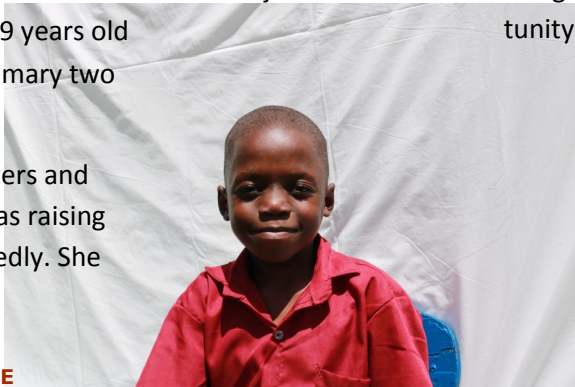
Mathias Talemwa (9yrs)

Faith Kisakye (17 yrs)

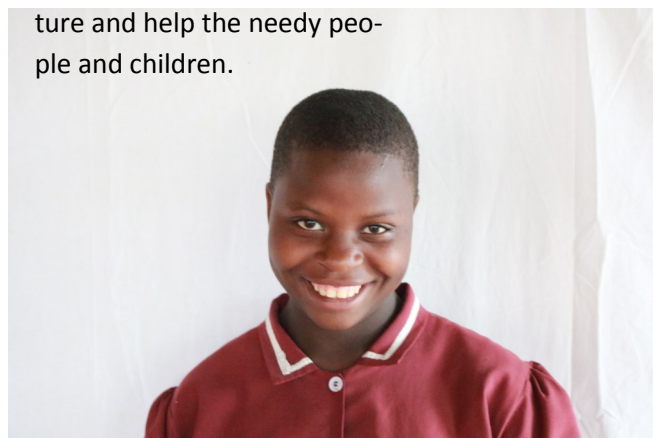
My name is Faith Kisakye, I am 17 years old and I am in primary six Class.

Antonia Maria Naggirinya (11 yrs)

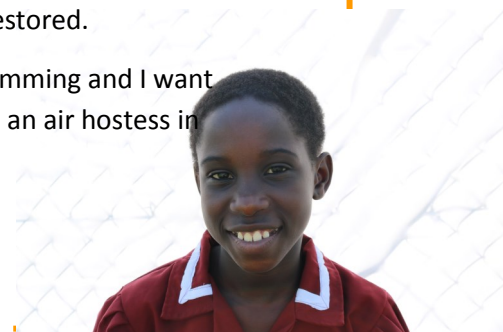
My name is Maria Naggirinya, I am 11 years old and I am in primary five Class.

unable to pay my fees. My desire was to study; so I walked to Early Learning and Aunt Agnes gave me an opportunity to study.

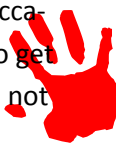

I am called Pretty and in primary one.

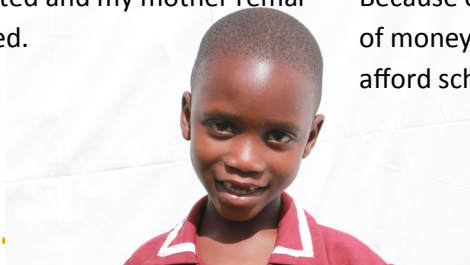
My father and mother separated and my mother remarried.

Shalom Kwagala (10yrs)

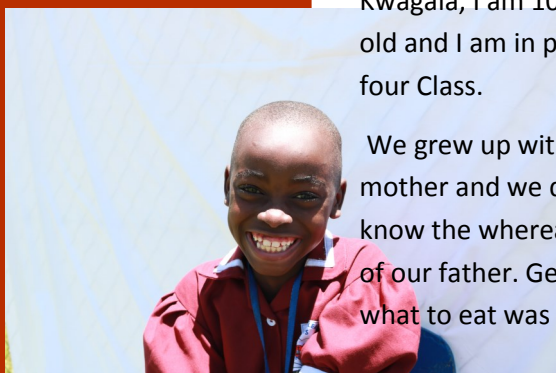
My name is Shalom Kwagala, I am 10 years old and I am in primary four Class.

My name is Sarah Amutuhire, I am 16 years old and I am in primary six Class.

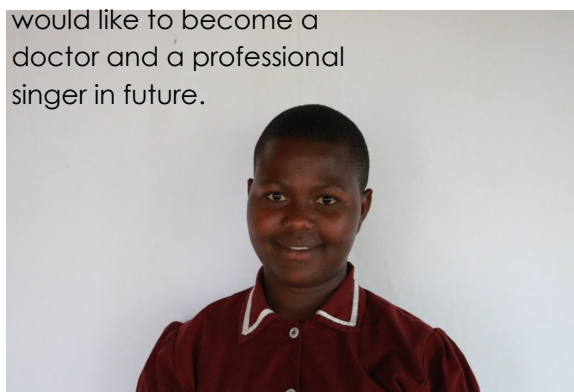
My sister Hannah was defiled by a 35 year old man from Rukungiri where we were staying. When my mother took the case to police, the village turned against our family saying that we had brought

My mother gave birth to two of us but my father died from an accident.

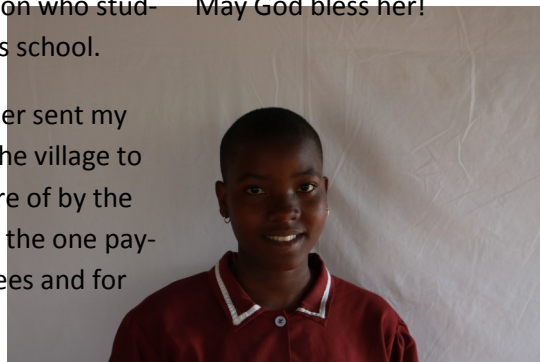
My mother has a small job where she has been trying to get some little money to look after us.

My name is Asuman Silver. My father was sick and was walking along the road alone.

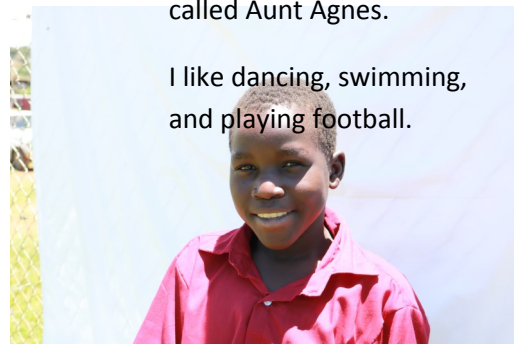
A car stopped and the woman who was driving it greeted me and asked if I was studying. I told her that my father was

Thank you mama Agnes for bringing happiness back to me. I am very happy being here.



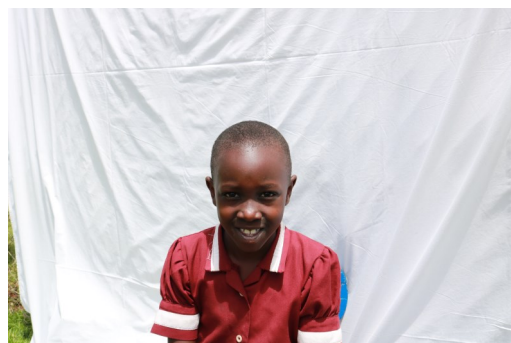

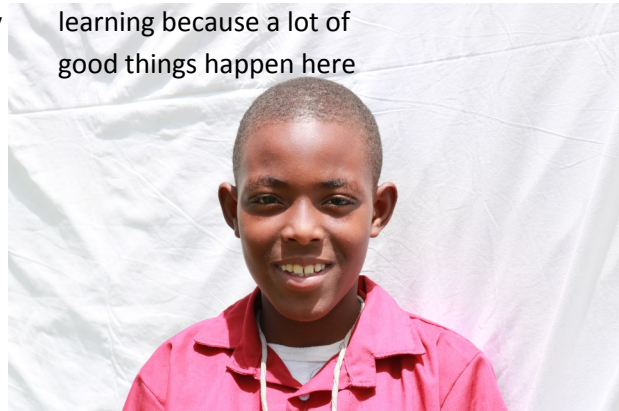

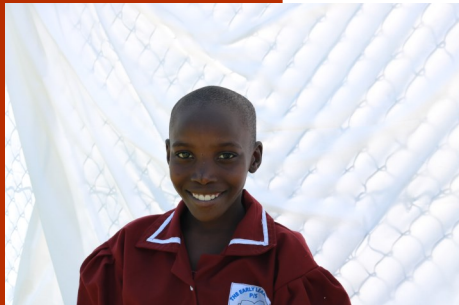

One day I got up and Starting walking to Entebbe, I got to the beach, a

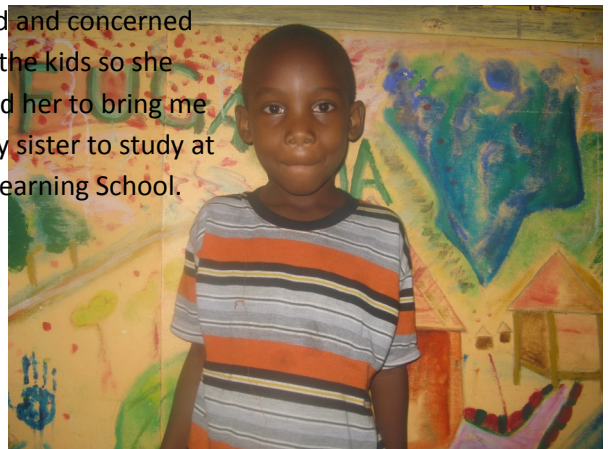

I went to the Village and whilst there my Mum sent me some money and clothing's but when I came back

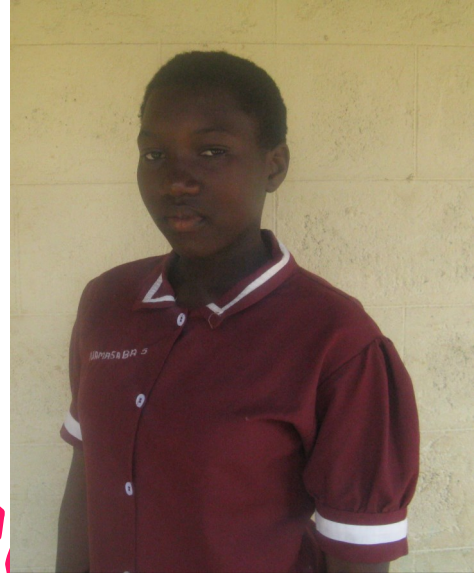
